If you decide not to accept the school offer and wish to appeal, you should log onto the Redbridge website to complete an appeals form.

Appeals are only for extenuating circumstances. You may be required to submit evidence to support your appeal.

The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services, however the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents and carers to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability, beliefs and family values.

Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network, individual apps and devices.

Parental controls can help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for.
- create content filters to block apps that may have inappropriate content.
- manage the content different family members can see.

Celebrating Cultural Connections-Celebrating diversity across our school:

Naomi Osaka - Professional Tennis Player

As a multicultural, multiracial, Japanese-Haitian-American woman, Naomi represents the modern world on and off the courts.

She's not just a tennis champion, but an entrepreneur, luminary and role model for young people across the globe. She has been ranked world No. 1 in singles by the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) and is the first Asian player to hold the top ranking in singles. Osaka is a four-time Grand Slam singles champion, with two Australian Open and two US Open titles. At the 2018 US Open and the 2019 Australian Open, Osaka won her first two major titles in back-to-back tournaments. She was the first woman to win successive major singles titles since Serena Williams in 2015, and the first to win her first two in successive majors since Jennifer Capriati in 2001.

In addition, Naomi has been an outspoken activist, drawing public attention to many important causes such as Black Lives Matter.
