## Message from the Headteacher:

Dear Parents/Carers, I am really disappointed to see an increase in negative incidents in the playground and the car park between parents.
Time is precious to us all, we all juggle a lot of responsibilities and a million things run through our minds while we are dropping off or collecting our children.

However, this does not give us permission to disrespect each other or feel our load is more important. Equality is one of our Cranbrook values and we are all equally important.
So I ask you to show respect to each other and remember we cannot control the actions of others but we can control our own and we are the example for our children.

If unfortunately you are faced with someone being rude to you, I ask you to approach a staff member for support and do your best not to engage with rude behaviour.

## Punctuality-Late collections:

Parents have a responsibility to ensure their child/ children are collected on time. I would like to remind all parents/ carers to be more punctual in collecting their child/ children. Parents have 15 minutes from the collection time to collect their child from the school playground.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 finish school at 3pm, if they are collected any later than 3:30pm they will be charged $£ 2.50$ for every 10 minutes they are late. Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 finish school at $3: 15 \mathrm{pm}$, if they are collected any later than $3: 45$ pm, they will be charged $£ 2.50$ for every 10 minutes they are late. The fee will only be waivered in exceptional circumstances.

## Every Day Matters -Let's win a fun day!

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best results. Research found that pupils who performed better as well. At Cranbrook, we will be celebrating when classes have had 15 days of $100 \%$ attendance with a non- uniform day. Why 15 days? One for every letter of the phrase, 'Every Day Matters'. You will receive a School Ping message to inform you if your child's class has a non-uniform day.

## Celebrating Cultural Connections-Celebrating diversity across our school:

Kadeena Cox: A sprinter from an early age, Kadeena Cox entered Para athletics in 2015 after being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. In her first international competition, Cox won T37 100m gold at the IPC Athletics World Championships.

Cox is also a GB cyclist and began her cycling journey in June 2015, travelling to her first major event in Maniago, Italy, as an independent rider. She was classified as a C2 and completed the time-trial.

At Rio 2016 Cox won three medals in athletics with gold in the T38 400m, silver in the $4 \times 100 \mathrm{~m}$ and bronze in the 100 m . She also completed a remarkable achievement by claiming a gold medal in cycling with victory in the C4-5 time trial to become the first British Paralympian for 32 years to win medals in two different sports.
