<u>Sara Wahedi</u>

Sara Wahedi is a technologist and human rights activist who has made security and safety her life's mission. She created the digital app, Ehtesab — a verified, monitored platform that shares real-time emergency information to Kabul residents in Afghanistan.

The digital app has become a lifeline, especially for women and girls, since the Taliban took control of the country in 2021, as they can get reliable information about the danger around them. Wahedi is an Afghan national who moved to Canada at the age of six but has returned to the country over the years for work. Wahedi is attending Columbia University where she is working on a dual degree in data science and urban studies.
