Message from the Headteacher:

Dear Parents,

This week is Refugee week, an arts & culture festival celebrating the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary.

Refugee week this year, invites us to think about and celebrate 'Our Home' and what that means to us. Home is first and foremost our place of refuge, where we feel safe and cared for, however home can also be a state of mind, the people we love, our places of learning /work and it is also our planet Earth.

Home can be more than one place and finding it can be a journey, as it is for so many who had to leave their countries and rebuild their lives. Sometimes home is found in a single person, other times it's in a whole community. And often, it's in a single gesture of care and welcome.

A key importance in making people feel at home is ensuring the respect of equality, diversity and inclusion. Equality means that everyone is treated fairly and has the same opportunities, regardless of their differences. Diversity is about recognising and celebrating differences, including race, gender, religion, disability, and sexual orientation. Inclusion means creating an environment where every individual feels valued and respected, and where everyone has a sense of belonging.

Junior Roadwatch with the Met Police

Last week here at Cranbrook Primary we had the police come to visit some Year six children to teach them all about what they do in the community to keep people safe as well as allowing the children to support them in their efforts to cut speeding on The Drive. The Junior Roadwatch Scheme is part of the Mayor, TfL and the Metropolitan Police's commitment to Vision Zero, which aims to eliminate death and serious injury from road collisions on London's streets and transport network. It enables the police to engage and educate all road users about how the speed at which people are driving or riding is the single most important factor in whether a collision takes place and how severely people are injured.

The children got to explore the police vehicles - including playing with the flashing lights and sirens - and understand how they are used on the roads, as well as see how the police enforce speed restrictions and learn more about the importance of speed awareness. We hope the children went home and shared everything that they learnt. They clearly had a fantastic time, coming back very excited from using speed guns and learning about the world of policing, and the other year six children can't wait for their turn in July.

Sophie Cruz

Sophie Cruz was born in the United States to undocumented immigrants from Oaxaca, Mexico. Her parents have been allowed to stay in the United States under the Deferred Action for Parents of Americans (DAPA) program. At five years old, Sophie went to Washington DC to be part of the crowd welcoming Pope Francis who was visiting on behalf of undocumented immigrants. In an attempt to help her parents and others like them, she wrote the Pope a letter of hope and wore a t-shirt that said "Papa Rescate" DAPA" (translation - "Father rescue DAPA"). Sophie met Pope Francis that day. He gave her one of his famous hugs and she gave him her letter asking for help. Her passion to help undocumented parents continues. Sophie's words, "I believe I have the right to live with parents. I have the right to be happy...All immigrants just like my dad feed this country. They deserve to live with dignity. They deserve to live with respect."
