Message from the Headteacher:

Dear Parents/ Carers,

This week saw the observance of Windrush Day. It was first officially recognised as a day of celebration in 2017 and takes place on 22 June each year to mark the anniversary of the arrival of HMT Empire Windrush on 22 June 1948.

According to records, the ship was carrying 1,027 passengers, 802 of whom gave their last country of residence as somewhere in the Caribbean; additional documented countries of residence are India, Pakistan, Kenya and South Africa.

On this day we recognise and thank all those who arrived on Empire Windrush (known as the Windrush Generation), and their descendants, for the enormous contributions they made to Britain during its recovery from the Second World War and have continued to make ever since.

Immigration has always been a key contributor to the economic wellbeing of the UK as well as contributing to the rich diversity and culture we all get to enjoy so it is important for us to celebrate our ancestors who gave so much and value those who join our communities now, contributing to all facets of community life

It is also crucial for our students to understand this part of our history and appreciate the diverse fabric that makes our school and our country so vibrant.

Thank you for your continued support in promoting an inclusive and respectful school environment. Let us all take a moment today to reflect on and celebrate the invaluable contributions of the Windrush generation to our shared history and culture.

Knut-Sverre Horn

Knut-Sverre is a reporter for the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation. He's been a bird and wildlife enthusiast for as long as he can remember, saving money for his first binoculars at age seven, getting his first SLR camera at age 12 and having his photos published in national magazines at age 14.

His entry for wildlife photograph of the year, offers a glimpse of kittiwake chicks illuminated in an abandoned factory. From his vantage point inside an abandoned fishprocessing factory, Knut-Sverre kept watch on the black-legged kittiwakes tending to their chicks on the windowsill. As midnight approached, the low summer sun struck the north-facing window, sharpening the birds' silhouettes and giving him the image that he wanted. Kittiwakes naturally nest on the narrow ledges of high, steep coastal cliffs. Recently numbers have plummeted, and some have headed for urban areas due to shortages of food caused by warming oceans and pollution.
